

WORK THAT COUNTS TOWARD YOUR VOLUNTEER HOURS (Don't forget planning & prep time!)

- Election Officials and Delegates
Work and travel time spent in the performance of duties by precinct chairs, state and county party officials, precinct convention participants, county convention delegates, state convention delegates, and national convention delegates.
- Clubs, Headquarters, and Campaigns
Work from home or elsewhere that supports a GOP club, headquarters, or campaign (including nonpartisan offices such as school board or city council).
Includes mailings, phone calls, computer activities, clerical tasks, and work involving candidate signs and literature.
- GOP Events and Conventions
Includes travel time to and from events, conventions, and GOP headquarters.
- Campaign Rallies
- Special events that support GOP philosophy and policies.
- Officers of Republican Women Clubs.
- Time spent on required duties, except attending regular club meetings.
- Presenting Political Programs and Speeches
Includes programs and speeches at GOP and civic clubs
- Running for Public Office
Includes all time spent campaigning.
- Voter Registration
- Get Out the Vote (GOTV)
- Fundraisers
Includes food preparation, work on donated items, decorating, and clean-up.

ATTENDANCE THAT COUNTS TOWARDS YOUR VOLUNTEER HOURS

- Seminars and Workshops
Must further the Republican philosophy, political views, or platform.
- TFRW Meetings and Conventions (Includes travel time.)
- Legislative Day (Includes travel time.)
- State Republican Convention and National Convention (Includes travel time.)
- Board and Committee Meetings (Includes travel time.)

THE EXCEPTION: Regular Club Meetings (Travel time counts.)

- Time spent working before or after the regular meeting counts.
- BUT, time spent in attendance at a regular club meeting does NOT count.
