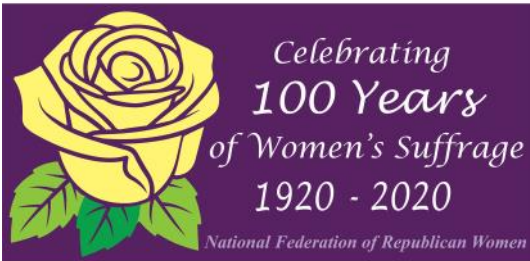

What advice would you give to others about getting back to business and out in the community as shelter in place restrictions are lifting?

"Be respectful to everyone, knowing there are many different needs and opinions. The unknown causes fear and over reaction, which we have experienced during the shutdown. Above all love well!"

"I feel like wearing a mask has become a political statement. From what I understand, the mask keeps any virus YOU may have and makes it so you are less likely to share that with me. For me, it isn't political. It is about protecting my child that has been given a diagnosis of cancer (Polycythemia Vera-PV). In fact PV attacks the very things that they attribute to COVID; red blood cell clots (causes strokes, embolisms, etc), problems breathing and iron issues. I appreciate it when others also wear a mask. I appreciate that they care enough for the people around them, even if THEY THEMSELVES are healthy, to have empathy for MY family.

That being said, there are people who are loosing livelihoods due to closing. I am NOT for that either. I have recently done a client event where we supported a small restaurant business – the clients came and picked-up the gratis meal. I stood in the parking lot and said hi. Did I go into the restaurant? No, I did not. But the restaurant worked within parameters that created comfort for what I needed as well. We found a win/win. I am still supporting the small gym my oldest son goes to – even though he hasn't been there since March. I have yet to get my hair done (ignore the grey if you see me!). My hair stylist is having me come in at 7:30 am one morning to limit any interaction (it will be the first time I am INSIDE a building for business). I understand that these business owners have spent years building-up/creating their dream and I want to make sure I support it, within the guidelines that still protects my 11 year old little boy. I think that there are ways that we can create win/wins for each other—this is a founding American principle!

I also think if we can handle this issue with empathy and understanding, we will be remembered as people who care. I think if we forget there are PEOPLE on both ends of this spectrum, we need to go back and read Matthew 25:45."

Frederick Frazier gives update on the goals and efforts of the Presidential Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice

Commission Reports To Attorney General Barr Outlining Measures To Improve Law Enforcement And Our Criminal Justice System

Frederick Frazier was appointed to the Presidential Commission on Law Enforcement and the Administration of Justice during a ceremony in Washington, D.C. on Jan. 22. The commission, at the direction of President Donald Trump, was created to explore modern issues affecting law enforcement and the ability to reduce crime in America.

As a 25-year veteran with the Dallas Police Department, Frazier has witnessed first-hand the negative effects policing has on its officers and staff.

Frazier's key areas of focus on the commission include law enforcement and civilian colleague's health and wellness, crime data and police reporting, and the restructure of bail reform. These issues are common across the country in most major cities.

Trump signed Executive Order No. 13896 in October, designating and authorizing Attorney General William P. Barr, to create the commission and assemble its members. Barr appointment Frazier, along with 15 other law enforcement officials from around the U.S.

The commissioners will work together to discover and study opportunities for progress, improvement and innovation across American law enforcement, Frazier said.

Law Enforcement and Civilian Colleagues Health & Wellness

Area of Concern: Officers today are facing PTSD, fatigue, sleep deprivation, poor diet and lack of nutrition. In their study, it has been recognized that approximately 100,000 active police officers in the U.S. suffer from PTSD, depression, anxiety and suicidal ideation.

Recommendations: Agencies should...

- establish a department-wide and agency-wide health and wellness program with both financial and non-financial incentives
- establish a wellness officer inside departments and agencies to oversee the wellness program
- establish a federally-funded National Crisis Line with 24/7 assistance for depression, addiction and PTSD

The foundation for a healthy police department should include mentoring, critical incident stress debriefing team, counseling services, mental health services, suicide prevention, physical healthcare, financial healthcare counseling, military transition support team, family support, therapy K9s, and close partnership with Chaplains.



Crime Data and Police Reporting

Area of Concern: Crime data and police reporting across the country is not uniform and years behind.

Recommendations: Congress should change the position of Director of Bureau Statistics from a presidential appointee to a career senior executive service position to ensure data collected and reported by the Principal Federal Statistical Agency in the Department of Justice is non-partisan.

A more unified long-term system across the country would allow for all departments and agencies to share information and see data in real time.

POLICING IN AMERICA

Recently, I participated in the Heritage Ranch Republican group's virtual meeting where I shared important information on the current state of policing in America and its effects in this election year.

Explain the current "policing issue" which has recently exploded in the US. The incident in Minneapolis with George Floyd shocked the nation, including law enforcement across the entire country. As a 25-year veteran in law enforcement, this should have never happened. This spurred an overwhelming rate of civil unrest across the country and has intensified and gained traction because its an election year. We saw the same thing happen in 2016 election year with paid activists agitating and swarming the streets destroying property and causing unrest in our cities to disrupt what was going on.

Explain how this will become a campaign issue. President Trump established the commission on law enforcement and the administration of justice to tackle rising crime in America. This is the first of its kind in over 50 years. The opposition is using the Minneapolis incident as a huge campaign issue calling for defunding the police.

Who is using the police the most? High crime areas use the police most, but the people in these communities are not actually the ones that are calling for defunding the police. If you dig deeper, you will find it's the paid activists taking advantage of these high crime communities and agitating the ones that live there. Departments across the country are already working on limited budgets and resources. There are murders happening in these high crime communities every day that none of these activists seem to care about, but the police do and the families of the victims do. Police want to solve the cases for the families and the families want justice, which takes resources. If you defund the police, you need to defund the entire judicial mechanism from the top down from legislators making the laws to prosecutors to judges to the DA's to police officers and to the jails.

For example: In 2019, Dallas had 1.7 million police contacts and 9 shootings. McKinney police officers had 77,000 reasons for contact and zero shootings. Is there a problem in policing? We have some problems, we have a training issue, and some issues we need to address, but we do not have the "systemic racism" problem that these activists and the media are pushing out to the general public.

When President Trump wins in November, many of these efforts will be deflated because we will have another four years with a strong President that is pro-police and pro-reform in the right way that protects our communities and the officers that serve them.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE



District Judge Emily Miskel is trailblazing her way through Covid-19 with first fully remote hearing in the state and first fully virtual trial in the nation

March 17 – 9:13 am – District Judge Emily Miskel holds the first fully remote hearing in the state in a family law temporary restraining order proceeding, a hearing that lasts just over one hour with 7 participants. The proceeding is streamed live on Judge Miskel’s court YouTube channel.

March 25 – District Judge Emily Miskel conducts the first fully virtual contested bench trial using Zoom.

May 8 – District Judge Emily Miskel oversees the first fully virtual jury trial in the nation, a non-binding summary jury trial in an insurance dispute. The jury selection is livestreamed to the court’s YouTube channel.
