Got Books?



“How to Talk to Liberals”

An Evening with LTC Allen West, retired

(Notes taken by Peggy Stodola)

What a great privilege it was to attend this event on Thursday, August 30th, at Lord of Life Lutheran Church. Col. West was on his game for sure, and the audience of 150+ was hanging on every word.

Col. West began the talk by stressing the need for “COURAGE.” He said that we (as conservatives) must have the courage to stand and fight. He took us down a short walk through history, beginning with 480 BC when King Leonidas spoke the words “molon labe” (come and take) in response to the Persian army’s demands for the surrender of his small band of Spartans. Fast forward to 1835 and the little town of Gonzalez, Texas, where the words “come and take it” were spoken in response to the demand from the Mexican army to return a small brass cannon that had previously been given to the town for protection from hostile Indians. Thus began the Texians fight for independence. We have a proud history of strong, courageous, willing fighters – including those who took a stand at the Alamo in March of 1836 and then those who later savored victory at San Jacinto in April of that year.

Col. West suggests that we welcome newcomers to Texas and ask them why they are here. If outsiders don’t know and understand our history, they will be inclined to transform our state into what they left behind. We must be informed and educated so we can share all the good things about Texas – what makes it great – a booming economy, no state income tax, etc.

Classical Liberalism vs. Progressive Socialism

John Locke (1632-1704) was an English philosopher who was considered the father of classical liberalism which holds that all men are entitled to the guarantees of life, liberty and property. We need to ask “What kind of liberal are you?”

Progressive Socialism follows the doctrines of Marx and Engels:

- 1) wealth re-distribution
- 2) nationalized economic production
- 3) create and expand welfare state (create dependency and enslavement which has resulted in the 21st century economic plantation)
- 4) social egalitarianism (which has resulted in the participation trophy mentality – everyone gets something even if they did nothing)

5) secular humanism (goal is to undermine people's faith)

Progressive socialists stress "equality of outcome" rather than "equality of opportunity."

Progressive socialists must control the media, courts and schools in order to fulfill their agenda.

How Do We Talk to Liberals? Give Them the Facts!

The Republican Party was founded in 1854 by anti-slavery activists. The Democrat Party is the party of the KKK, of the Jim Crow laws, of slavery, of segregation, of secession, and of socialism. They were the party of poll taxes and literacy tests. The 13th, 14th and 15th amendments were not supported by Democrats.

Booker T. Washington, Harriet Tubman, Frederick Douglas were all Republicans. The "turning point" when African Americans began to align with the Democrat party began during the presidential campaign between John F. Kennedy and Richard Nixon. Martin Luther King, Jr. was in jail, and it was suggested that both candidates contact his wife, Coretta, to express their condolences and offer support. Apparently (not substantiated), only JFK followed through! From that time on, there were three portraits in the homes of most African American families: Jesus, MLK and JFK. Then Lyndon Johnson and his Great Society came about and instead of providing hope and a way out of poverty, actually created economic enslavement. Between 1961 and 1975 77% of black families had a two income/two parent home. Today that is just 24%.

Margaret Sanger (founder of Planned Parenthood) was a white supremacist and proclaimed that blacks were undesirable. She even spoke at Klan meetings. Since 1973 (Roe v. Wade) 18 million black babies have been aborted. There are a disproportionate number of abortions performed on black women than on any other group.

When the NRA was founded in 1871 they stood up for the 2nd Amendment rights for freed slaves. They are actually the oldest civil rights organization in the US.

Resources You Should Read

Col. West encouraged all of us to read the Declaration, the Constitution and the Federalist Papers -- so we can know what we're talking about. And September 17 is Constitution Day! All of our members should have at least one pocket constitution with them at all times. Always be ready to give it away to someone who doesn't have one.

Liberty vs. Tyranny

Our challenge is to proclaim truth. We need to compare and contrast the different issues and positions of the parties, and we need to tell our story in 90 seconds.

Col. West urges us to use the term “free market” rather than “capitalism.” He talked about the ancient Chinese philosopher and military general Sun Tzu who cautioned that we need to know our enemy. [Note: That entire quote from Sun Tzu is: “If you know the enemy and know yourself, you need not fear the result of a hundred battles. If you know yourself but not the enemy, for every victory gained you will also suffer a defeat. If you know neither the enemy nor yourself, you will succumb in every battle.”]

Col. West concluded by reading a portion of an address given by President Abraham Lincoln in Baltimore, MD on April 18, 1864:

The world has never had a good definition of liberty, and the American people, just now, are much in need of one. We all declare for liberty; but in using the same word we do not all mean the same thing.

With some the word liberty may mean for each man to do as he pleases with himself, and the product of his labor; while with others the same word may mean for some men to do as they please with other men, and the product of other men’s labor. Here are two, not only different, but incompatible things, called by the same name — liberty. And it follows that each of the things is, by the respective parties, called by two different and incompatible names — liberty and tyranny.

So here we are with the two options: liberty vs. tyranny

Will we have the courage, the knowledge and the character to make the right choice?

[Note: Col. West asked that we pray for him and his family, that he would be sensitive to the calling of the Lord regarding what lies ahead. He has a new book that will be released on October 16th, “Hold Texas, Hold the Nation: Victory or Death” which can be pre-ordered on Amazon. Col. - He’s the only Democrat currently running who is openly stating that he will pursue impeachment of Trump


He’s definitely a clear and present danger and is the #1 fund raiser in the US. \$10.4 million 1Quarter.




